Food Insecurity



According to the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency, world food insecurity is primarily due to three factors.

Factor number one is exceptional shortfall in aggregate food production/supplies, which is a result of crop failure, natural disasters, interruption

of imports, disruption of distribution, excessive post-harvest losses, or other supply bottlenecks.

Factor number two is widespread lack of access occurs, which occurs when a majority of the population is considered to be unable to procure food from local markets due to very low incomes, exceptionally high food prices, or the inability to circulate within the country.

Factor number three is a severe localized food insecurity due to the influx of refugees, a concentration of internally displaced persons, or areas with combinations of crop failure and deep poverty.

With a common currency and free trade, localized crop failures and natural disasters will have minimal impact on food availability. Protection of <u>objective</u> <u>rights</u> and the <u>right to treble land</u> ends most supply disruptions.

The <u>Earth Dividend</u> ends the problem of low incomes and an absence of local markets, the <u>VIP Treasury</u> prevents exceptionally high food prices, and <u>exit rights</u> prevent the inability to circulate. Refugees are no longer a problem, as they bring their Earth Dividend basket of distributions wherever they roam. <u>Land-based capitalism</u> and the Earth Dividend food distribution will eliminate almost all potential causes of food insecurity.

The Food Distribution

The food distribution will feed a single person with some serious budgeting, yet it can feed two people comfortably, and four people abundantly. Eight people can dine on the finest cuisine. Unlike food programs that reduce benefits with large families, the Earth Dividend food distribution encourages economies of scale.

If you prefer to dine out or purchase fully prepared food, the food distribution can be used as partial, or in some cases, full payment.

Maximum Prepared Food Allotment Per Day

Breakfast	\$1.85
Lunch	\$2.65
Dinner	\$3.56

The table is a hypothetical allotment for prepared meals. The three allotments can each be used once daily toward restaurant meals, church/community center meals, or prepared food at supermarkets. The allotment need not correspond to the time of day, although allotments cannot be used within 3 hours of each other.

The food distribution cannot be used for the purchase of alcoholic beverages, nor can it be used for tips or any other direct payment of wages.

There is <u>VIP support</u> for fund transfer within a <u>sovereignty</u>. Typically, each family member transfers all or part of their food distribution to the family shopper.

Sovereignties that engage in producing and distributing food might transfer the food distribution to farmers for purchase of livestock, seeds, and farm equipment.

If there is an abundance of food and a surplus food distribution, there are ways to reallocate the surplus distribution.

The food distribution is considered part of a child's constitutional right to life.
